MYSTERY

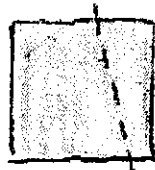
Part 2:

For this month, you will need to use only the blue squares.

1. Stack four blue squares, and using stickers or paper and pins, write a number in the upper left hand corner of each square, numbering them from 1 to 4.

Number 1 is on the top, with number 4 at the bottom.

2. Bring your stack to the cutting mat, place your ruler as shown in the example, and make a cut through the stack. Please don't make the cut too close to the edge of your fabric.



3. From the numbered stack of pieces, take the right bottom piece and bring it to the top of that same stack.

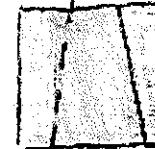
4. Sew the two top pieces together, then the next two, until all four are sewn together. Press



If the pieces don't match perfectly, that's OK.

5. Restack with the numbers in the same corner, with number 1 at the top and number 4 at the bottom of the stack.

6. For the second cut, place your ruler as shown in the example and cut through the stack. Again, please don't make the cut too close to the edge of your fabric.



7. From the numbered stack of pieces, take the two pieces from the bottom (numbers 3 and 4) and bring them to the top of that same stack.

8. Sew in pairs again. Press

9. Restack your blocks again with the numbers in the same corner, with number 1 on the top and number 4 on the bottom of the stack.



10. Following the above instructions, do the same two more times, with 4 blue squares each time.
