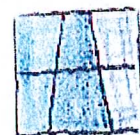
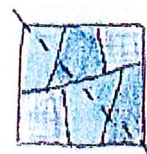

MYSTERY

Part 5:

1. Take out all 12 blue blocks, 4 yellow and 4 orange/rust blocks, and square up each of them so they are all consistent in size. For example, if you started out with a 6 inch block, you may be able to trim it up to 5 ½ inches or even 5 ¾ inches. Get the most out of your blocks.
2. There are 8 blue, 4 yellow and 4 orange/rust blocks all sewn alike.
3. Cut them in two from corner to corner as shown in the example. Do not sew together.
4. Cut the remaining 4 blue blocks in two as shown in the example. These are the 4 blocks that were put aside in Part 3.
5. These pieces are to be sewn together in pairs in a strip as shown in the example.



Put all the blocks away and wait for next clue in March
